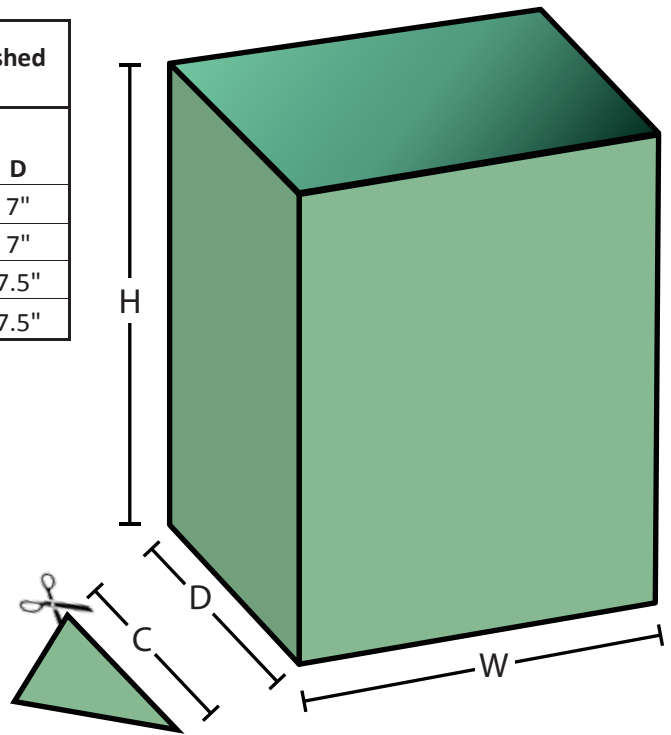
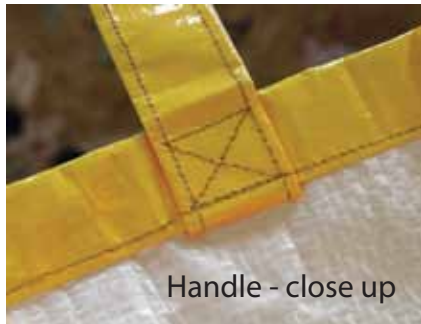


Utility bags made from feed bags

| width of feed bag | cut to length | cut off corner (C) * | Approximate finished dimensions | | |

DIRECTIONS

1. Clean feed bag inside and out with wet cloth and vinegar solution
2. Cut handles (two 3.5" X 16" strips) from top or bottom of bag
3. Cut bag to length specified above
4. Bind bottom seam with serger or zigzag stitch
5. Cut of corners to specified width (C) * **NOTE:** adjust corner cut as needed to not "fight" with existing seams or folds
6. Bind corner seam with serger or zigzag stitch of approximately 1/4"
7. Reinforce the bottom and corner seams with a second line of stitching
8. Fold in 3/4" on each side on the strips for handles and sew around the edges
9. With bag inside out, fold under top edge about 3/4"
10. Insert handle strips ends under folded top edge of the bag
11. Secure handles in place in the middle of each wide edge of the bag with about 4" between the ends of each handle strip
12. Sew around the top edge of the bag including the handles. Reinforce the handle stitching with extra stitches (e.g., X-pattern)
